PALM BEACH GARDENS, Fla. -- The 2005 Callaway Golf PGA Junior Series will celebrate its 10th consecutive year of providing affordable and competitive golf for juniors age 13 to 17, featuring six new sites in a 11-state summer coast-to-coast schedule. The PGA Junior Series, marking its third year with title sponsor Callaway Golf, opens May 31 - June 2, at Mississippi State University Golf Club in Starkville, Miss., and concludes Aug. 8-9, at Royce Brook Golf Club in Somerville, N.J. This summer's schedule features 12 events, including five 54-hole (three-day) and seven 36-hole (two-day) competitions.

The Callaway Golf PGA Junior Series, nationally recognized in the GolfWeek Sagarin points system and Junior Golf Scoreboard, debuted in the summer of 1996. The program has attracted boys and girls representing 50 states, 18 countries, and six continents, along with players from Bermuda, Guam, The Mariana and Marshall Islands, and the District of Columbia. "The Callaway Golf PGA Junior Series is a premier competitive program that brings together many of the best boy and girl players throughout the country," said PGA of America President Roger Warren. "We welcome back Callaway Golf as title sponsor as it joins us in sharing a tradition of excellence in junior golf. Additionally, the support and hospitality of our PGA Sections makes for an atmosphere rivaling that of a major championship. We also have been fortunate to connect event sites to the PGA's Professional Golf Management programs promoting our Career Awareness initiatives, along with opportunities to view the PGA Club Professional Championship at Kiawah Island Resort and the PGA Championship at Baltusrol Golf Club in New Jersey."

Each Series event will feature a field of 150 players. Juniors may enter as often as they wish. Each event will consist of boys and girls' divisions and will have approximately one-half of the field from competitors residing within the host section of the country.
